(cc) "Manufacturing" means putting raw materials through a series of steps that brings about a change in their composition or physical nature in order to make a new and different item of tangible personal property that will be sold to another. Manufacturing begins at the point at which raw materials reach the first machine or piece of equipment involved in changing the form of the material and ends at the point at which manufacturing has altered the material to its completed form. Placing materials into containers, packages, or wrapping in which they are sold to the ultimate consumer is part of this manufacturing process. **Unless otherwise provided for in Item** (aa) of this Subparagraph, manufacturing, for purposes of this Subparagraph, does not include any of the following:

D. In addition to any other credits against the tax payable on net income which the law allows to an individual taxpayer, the taxpayer shall be entitled to the tax credit against the tax payable on net income provided for as follows:

(1) Beginning for tax years beginning on and after January 1, 2009, a taxpayer required to file a Louisiana tax return may claim tax credit for educational expenses incurred after January 1, 1988, for each child between four and eighteen years of age attending

kindergarten, elementary, or secondary school (kindergarten through twelfth grade), if the child qualifies as a dependency exemption on the taxpayer's Louisiana income tax return.

(2)(a) Any taxpayer who so qualifies shall be entitled to a maximum tax credit of twenty-five fifty dollars per child for educational expenses.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection (F) of this Section, the credit provided in this Subsection shall be refundable."
