To enact the Omnibus Bond Authorization Act of 2016 and to repeal the Act which originated as House Bill No. 3 of the 2016 Regular Session of the Legislature, relative to the implementation of a five-year capital improvement program; to provide for the repeal of certain prior bond authorizations; to provide for new bond authorizations; to provide for authorization and sale of such bonds by the State Bond Commission; and to provide for related matters.

HOUSE BILL NO. 24-

BY REPRESENTATIVE ANDERS

AN ACT To amend and reenact R.S. 22:832(A)(3) and to enact R.S. 22:832(C)(6) and (F), relative to the insurance premium tax; to exempt health maintenance organizations from the reduction of the tax due made in Act No. 10 of the 2016 First Extraordinary Session; to provide for qualifying Louisiana investments of health maintenance organizations; to provide for effectiveness; and to provide for related matters.

HOUSE BILL NO. 29-

BY REPRESENTATIVE PRICE

AN ACT To amend and reenact R.S. 47:115(A)(3) and (C) and 1624 and to repeal R.S. 47:287.657, 617, and 1624.1, relative to the payment of interest on certain overpayments; to provide for the calculation of interest on certain overpayments; to provide for the authority of the secretary of the Department of Revenue to pay interest on overpayments; to provide for certain limitations and requirements; to provide for effectiveness; and to provide for related matters.
