On motion of Senator Jackson-Andrews, the reading of the Journal was dispensed with and the Journal of June 3, 2024, was adopted.

Messages from the Governor

The following messages from the Governor were received and read as follows:

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR PROCLAMATION NUMBER 73 JML 2024

CALL AND CONVENE THE LEGISLATURE OF LOUISIANA INTO EXTRAORDINARY SESSION

By virtue of the authority vested in me by La. Const. art. III, § 2(B), I, Jeff Landry, Governor of the State of Louisiana, HEREBY

CALL AND CONVENE THE LEGISLATURE OF LOUISIANA INTO EXTRAORDINARY SESSION to convene at the State Capitol, in the city of Baton Rouge, Louisiana during 20 calendar days, beginning at 3:00 p.m. on the 6th day of November 2024, and ending no later than 6:00 p.m. on the 25th day of November 2024. The power to legislate at such session shall be limited, under penalty of nullity, to the following specified enumerated objects:

To propose amendments to the constitution and legislate relative to revenue and finance, including state and local revenue and finance, general revenue and finance provisions, power to tax, legislative authority, taxation, limitations, individual income tax, sales and use tax, corporation income tax, corporation franchise tax, severance tax, motor vehicle license tax, ad valorem property tax, excise tax, ad valorem property tax millages, state debt, exclusions, exemptions, deductions, reductions, credits, incentives, rebates, tax liabilities, tax collection, tax authority, tax administration, tax assessors, funds, establishment, consolidation, modification, and elimination of treasury funds, trusts, dedicated revenues, revenue sharing, expenditures, appropriations, unclaimed property, investment of funds, allocation of funds, Hospital Stabilization Formula, budgets, reports and records, donations, loans, or pledges of public credit, certain obligations, tax prescription, tax sales, and to provide for related matters.

To legislate relative to the payment of permanent teacher and school personnel pay raises by paying down the unfunded accrued liability of the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana ("TRSL") and by appropriation, and relative to authority of TRSL regarding calculation of system liabilities and required funding, and amortization.

ITEM 3: To legislate with regard to corporation franchise tax, including rates, exemptions, deductions, reductions, credits, and incentives claimed against the corporation franchise tax.

ITEM 4: To legislate with regard to corporation income tax, including rates, exemptions, deductions, reductions, credits, and incentives claimed against the corporation income tax.

ITEM 5: To legislate with regard to individual income tax, including rates, exemptions, deductions, reductions, credits, and incentives claimed against the individual income tax.

ITEM 6: To legislate with regard to income tax on estates and trusts, including rates, exemptions, deductions, reductions, credits, and incentives claimed against the income tax on estates and trusts.

ITEM 7: To increase the standard deduction applied against individual income tax for individuals sixty-five years of age or older.

ITEM 8: To legislate with regard to state sales and use tax and local sales and use tax, including rates, exemptions, deductions, reductions, exclusions, credits, rebates, and alternative reporting methods.

To legislate with regard to severance tax, including rates, exemptions, administration, and dedications of mineral revenues.

ITEM 10: To legislate with regard to ad valorem property taxation, millages, assessments, rates, exemptions, and with regard to funding for incentives in lieu of taxation.

ITEM 11: To legislate with regard to dedications, collections, revenues, and taxes.

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ITEM 12: To legislate with regard to incentives for the purpose of economic development.

ITEM 13: To legislate with regard to the taxation of digital products, digital goods, digital services, and non-digital services.

ITEM 14: To legislate with regard to an expenditure limit, and relative to identifying efficiencies and costs savings in state government.

ITEM 15: To legislate relative to the Louisiana Citizens Property Insurance Corporation to provide for the funding for the fortified roof programs for policy holders of the Louisiana Citizens Property Insurance Corporation.

ITEM 16: To legislate with regard to the Oilfield Site Restoration Fund, to revise fees, and to provide for administration by the Natural Resources Trust Authority.

ITEM 17: To legislate relative to incentives to leasing on state lands by revising the authority of the State Mineral and Energy Board.

ITEM 18: To legislate relative to funding for purchase of instructional materials and supplies for students enrolled in a vocational agriculture, agribusiness, or agriscience course.

ITEM 19: To propose amendments to the constitution and legislate regarding the crimes that are not subject to special juvenile procedures and the legislature's authority to make that determination.

ITEM 20: To propose amendments to the constitution and legislate relative to the judicial branch regarding specialty courts, the Supreme Court's authority to regulate disciplinary proceedings and unethical practices, vacancies in judgeships, elections for vacancies in judgeships, and related matters.

To legislate with regard to the appropriation of funds, including supplemental appropriations, and making modifications from certain sources for Fiscal Year 2024-2025, and to provide for the transfer, deposit, and use, as specified, of monies in certain treasury funds and accounts, for the objects specifically enumerated in this proclamation for the extraordinary session

ITEM 22: To legislate relative to calling a special statewide election for the purposes of allowing all voters, registered and qualified, to vote on the constitutional amendments.

ITEM 23: To legislate to provide funding for purposes of calling and holding a special election on the constitutional amendments.

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 2

BY SENATOR Barrow

A RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the State of Louisiana that a Committee of six be appointed to act with such a Committee as the House of Representatives may appoint to notify the Governor that the Legislature is now duly convened and organized and prepared to receive such communication as he may desire to lay before it.

On motion of Senator Barrow, the resolution was read by title and adopted.

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Prefiled Senate Bills and Joint Resolutions to be Introduced and Referred

Senator Barrow asked for and obtained a suspension of the rules to introduce and read prefiled Senate Bills and Joint Resolutions a first and second time and refer them to committee.

SENATE BILL NO. 1—
BY SENATOR MORRIS AND REPRESENTATIVE MCMAKIN A JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing to amend Article V, Sections 5(B), 15(A), and 16(A) of the Constitution of Louisiana, relative to jurisdiction of courts; to provide for disciplinary proceedings over attorneys from other jurisdictions concerning legal services in the state and over related unethical practices; to authorize creation of courts of limited or specialized jurisdiction; and to specify an election for submission of the proposition to electors and provide a ballot proposition.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Judiciary A.

SENATE BILL NO. 2—
BY SENATORS CLOUD AND MORRIS AND REPRESENTATIVE VILLIO
A JOINT RESOLUTION
Proposing to amend Article V, Section 19 of the Constitution of Louisiana, relative to special juvenile proceedings; to provide relative to offenses committed by juveniles; to allow adult prosecution for offenses provided by law; and to specify an election for submission of the proposition to electors and provide a ballot proposition.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Judiciary C.

SENATE BILL NO. 3—
BY SENATOR HENSGENS AND REPRESENTATIVE GEYMANN
A JOINT RESOLUTION

Will Sections 10(C) and (E) and 11

Proposing to amend Article VII, Sections 10(C) and (E) and 11(A) of the Constitution of Louisiana, relative to state finances; to provide for calculation of a limit above which certain funds may only be appropriated for certain purposes; to provide for exceptions; to authorize the legislature to change the limit in certain circumstances; to provide for the establishment of an initial limit; to provide relative to the duties of the governor with respect to state finances; to provide with respect to the powers and duties of the Revenue Estimating Conference; and to specify an election for submission of the proposition to electors and provide a ballot proposition.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Finance.

SENATE BILL NO. 4-

BY SENATOR HENSGENS AND REPRESENTATIVE GEYMANN AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 39:34(C), 38(B), and 54(C) and to enact R.S. 39:33.3, relative to state finances; to provide relative to the calculation of a limit above which certain funds may only be appropriated for certain purposes; to provide relative to exceptions; to provide for definitions; to provide relative to the authority of the governor; to provide relative to the powers and duties of the commissioner of administration; to provide relative to the powers and duties of the Revenue Estimating Conference; to provide for a special effective date; and to provide for related

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Finance.

SENATE BILL NO. 5—
BY SENATOR MORRIS AND REPRESENTATIVE MCMAKIN
A JOINT RESOLUTION
Proposing to amend Article V, Section 22(B) of the Constitution of
Louisiana, relative to judicial elections; to provide for election dates for newly-created judgeships or vacancies in office of judge; to provide for exceptions involving courts of limited or specialized jurisdictions upon request from the supreme court concerning persons appointed to fill these positions; and to specify an election for submission of the proposition to electors and provide a ballot proposition.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Judiciary A.

SENATE BILL NO. 6—

BY SENATOR TALBOT

AN ACT

To enact R.S. 22:2297(C)(4), relative to the Louisiana Citizens Property Insurance Corporation; to provide for the Louisiana Fortify Homes Program; to authorize the governing board of the corporation to enter into a cooperative endeavor agreement; to provide for approval; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Insurance.

SENATE BILL NO. 7-

BY SENATOR LUNEAU

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 13:4163, relative to legislative continuance or extension for legislators and legislative employees; to provide for motions involving legislative continuance or extension; to provide a presumption that a motion is proper; to provide for oppositions to a motion for continuance or extension; to provide for proof of opposition to a motion by clear and convincing proof; to provide for denial of a motion for continuance or extension; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Judiciary A.
