C. Any person not licensed by the commissioner who has

been aggrieved by any act, cease or desist order, fine, or order or any other action of the commissioner pursuant to R.S. 22:1961 et seq. may appeal to any district court for which venue is proper. The court shall conduct its review without a jury and by trial de novo, except that if all parties, including the commissioner, so stipulate, the review shall be confined to the record. Portions of the record may be introduced by stipulation into evidence in a

trial de novo as to those parties so stipulating.

D. The filing of an appeal pursuant to this Section shall stay the application of any cease and desist order, fine, order, or other action of the commissioner to the appealing party unless the court, after giving the party notice and an opportunity to be heard, determines that a stay would be detrimental to the interest

of the public.
