PROCLAMATION NUMBER 80 JBE 2018

By virtue of the authority vested in me by Paragraph B of Section 2 of Article III of the Constitution of Louisiana, I, John Bel Edwards, Governor of the state of Louisiana, HEREBY CALL AND CONVENE THE LEGISLATURE OF LOUISIANA INTO EXTRAORDINARY SESSION to convene at the State Capitol, in the city of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, during fourteen calendar days, beginning at 4:00 o'clock p.m. on the 22nd day of May, 2018, and ending no later than the 4th day of June, 2018. The power to legislate at such session shall be limited, under penalty of nullity, to the following specified enumerated objects:

- ITEM NO. 1: To legislate to provide for making supplemental appropriations for the Fiscal Year 2017-2018.
- ITEM NO. 2: To legislate to provide for the ordinary operating expenses of state government for the Fiscal Year 2018-2019.
- ITEM NO. 3: To legislate to appropriate funds for the expenses of the judiciary for the Fiscal Year 2018-2019.
- ITEM NO. 4: To legislate to appropriate funds for the expenses of the legislature for the Fiscal Year 2018-2019.
- ITEM NO. 5: To legislate to provide for the ancillary expenses of state government for the Fiscal Year 2018-2019.
- ITEM NO. 6: To legislate to provide for making supplemental appropriations for the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 for the ordinary operation expenses of state government, for the expense of the Legislature, and for the expenses of the judiciary.
- ITEM NO. 7: To legislate to provide for the Revenue Sharing Distribution for the Fiscal Year 2018-2019.
- ITEM NO. 8: To legislate with regard to the capital outlay budget and the capital outlay program for the Fiscal Year 2018-2019.

- ITEM NO. 25: To legislate with regard to the tax credits for ad valorem taxes paid on vessels operating in Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act Waters and on public service properties by telephone companies.
- ITEM NO. 26: To legislate with regard to the imposition, collection and remittance of sales and use tax under R.S. 47:302 and to amend the definition of dealer.
- ITEM NO. 27: To legislate with regard to the sales and use tax rebate, the project facility expense rebate, and the investment tax credit under the Enterprise Zone, Quality Jobs and Competitive Project Payroll Programs.
- ITEM NO. 28: To legislate with regard to the tax treatment of refunds in computing corporate income tax.
- ITEM NO. 29: To legislate with regard to depreciation and expensing of property for purposes of state income tax.
- ITEM NO. 30: To legislate with regard to the Deepwater Horizon Economic Damages Collection Fund.

AN ACT

To provide for the transfer of certain monies from funds established by law or the Constitution of Louisiana to the state general fund in accordance with the provisions of Article VII, Section 10(F)(2)(b) of the Constitution of Louisiana; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Finance.

SENATE BILL NO. 2—

BY SENATOR CLAITOR

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 47:551(D)(8)(a), relative to the distribution of the local avails of the automobile rental tax; to provide for the dedication of certain avails collected in East Baton Rouge Parish; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs.

SENATE BILL NO. 3—

BY SENATOR JOHNS

AN ACT

To amend and reenact the introductory paragraph of R.S. 51:1787(A)(1)(a)(iv), R.S. 51:1787(A)(1)(a)(iv)(bb) and (cc), 2455(D)(3) and 2457(B)(3)(b) and (c), relative to the administration of incentive rebates; to change the application period for certain incentive rebates; to provide for issuance of rebate payments for certain tax incentive programs; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs.

SENATE BILL NO. 4—

BY SENATOR LAFLEUR

AN ACT

To enact R.S. 39:100.22, relative to special treasury funds; to establish the Overcollections and Deficit Management Fund as a special fund in the state treasury; to provide for the transfer, dedication, use, investment, and appropriation of funds in the

state treasury; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Finance.

SENATE BILL NO. 5—
BY SENATOR LAFLEUR

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 39:91(B) and (E) and to enact Subpart F-2 of Part II-A of Chapter 1 of Subtitle I of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 39:99.51 through 99.69, relative to the issuance of bonds to securitize the state's allocation of the economic damage settlement of the Deepwater Horizon oil spill economic damage litigation; to create the Louisiana New Roads and Infrastructure Corporation; to provide for the qualifications of the members of the corporation; to provide for the authority of the corporation to issue bonds; to provide for the pledge and transfer of certain assets of the state to the corporation; to provide for the deposit of the proceeds of the bonds into the Deepwater Horizon Economic Damages Collection Fund; to provide for the use of the monies in the Deepwater Horizon Economic Damages Collection Fund; to authorize the financing, purchase, ownership, and management of payments from the Deepwater Horizon economic damage settlement; to provide for the security for the payment of the bonds; to provide for bond validation actions; to provide for tax exemptions; to provide for ancillary contracts and derivative instruments; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Finance.

SENATE BILL NO. 6—
BY SENATOR LUNEAU

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 51:1787(A)(1)(a)(iv) and (b), 2455(A) and (D)(3), 2457(B)(3)(b) and (c), 3121(C)(3)(b)(i) and (4)(c), and Section 6 of Act No. 126 of the 2015 Regular Session of the Legislature, to enact R.S. 51:2456(B)(1)(a)(iv) and (b)(iv), and to repeal Section 3 of Act No. 126 of the 2015 Regular Session of the Legislature and Section 2 of Act No. 28 of the 2016 First Extraordinary Session of the Legislature, relative to limitations on tax incentive rebate programs; to provide for issuance of rebate payments for certain tax incentive programs; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs.

SENATE BILL NO. 7—
BY SENATOR MORRELL

AN ACT

To amend and reenact Section 4 of Act No. 109 of the 2015 Regular Session of the Legislature and R.S. 47:33(A)(4), (5), and (6), to enact R.S. 47:33(A)(7), and to repeal Section 2 of Act No. 109 of the 2015 Regular Session of the Legislature, relative to tax credits; to provide with respect to the individual income tax credit for taxes paid to other states; to eliminate the termination of limitations previously enacted; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs.

SENATE BILL NO. 8—
BY SENATOR MORRELL

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 47:302(V)(1), relative to sales tax administration; to provide a definition of dealer for purposes of the sales tax on online and catalog sales; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs.

SENATE BILL NO. 9—
BY SENATOR MORRELL

A JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing to amend Article VII, Section 2 of the Constitution of Louisiana, relative to limitations on taxation; to require a two-thirds vote of each house of the legislature for the creation, renewal, or expansion of a tax credit or rebate; and to specify an election for submission of the proposition to electors and provide a ballot proposition.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs.

SENATE BILL NO. 10—
BY SENATOR MORRELL

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 47:297.8(A), relative to individual income tax; to provide for an increase of the earned income tax credit against state tax; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

SENATE BILL NO. 12—
BY SENATOR PEACOCK

AN ACT

To enact R.S. 47:301(10)(z), relative to state sales and use tax on water sold for residential use; to exempt water for residential use from state sales and use tax when a residence is not separately metered; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs.

SENATE BILL NO. 13—
BY SENATOR WARD

AN ACT

To enact Subpart D of Part I of Chapter 1 of Subtitle I of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 39:16.1 through 16.12, and to repeal R.S. 39:6(C), relative to the reporting of expenditures on the state's fiscal transparency website; to provide for the statewide implementation of the enterprise resource planning system; to provide the duties of the commissioner of administration relative to the information to be accessible on the website; to provide definitions; to provide for the information to be included on the website; to provide that the appropriation acts for the executive, judicial, and legislative branches of government be included on the website; to provide for links to the websites of state agencies, the legislature, the judiciary, and the legislative auditor; to provide relative to the

reporting of contracts, expenditures, and incentive expenditures; to provide relative to reporting by the state retirement systems and the state treasurer; to provide for reports and audits to be published on the website; to provide for free public use of the website; to provide for an employment and salary database; to provide for the information which shall be excluded from the website; to provide relative to a schedule for the completion and maintenance of the website; to provide for the reporting of the use of state funds by the recipient of state funds; to provide for audits; to provide relative to the authority of the division of administration to expenditures of the legislature or the judiciary; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Finance.

SENATE BILL NO. 14— BY SENATOR MORRELL

AN ACT

To enact the Omnibus Bond Authorization Act of 2018, relative to the implementation of a five-year capital improvement program; to provide for the repeal of certain prior bond authorizations; to provide for new bond authorizations; to provide for authorization and sale of such bonds by the State Bond Commission; to provide relative to the submission of capital outlay applications; to provide with respect to the resubmission of certain capital outlay budget requests; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3— BY SENATOR MORRELL

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To adopt Joint Rule 21 of the Joint Rules of Order of the Senate and House of Representatives, relative to legislative instruments that enact or amend tax preferences; to require that all legislative instruments enacting or amending tax preferences include a sunset date, a cost-benefit analysis requirement, and a stated policy goal.

The resolution was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Senate and Governmental Affairs.
